September has been a great month! I don't know about you, but we on the search committee have been so pleased to have Pastor Keith as our Transitional Pastor. He has been with us less than a month, and yet I already sense a collective sigh of relief in our congregation, as we sit under his capable and seasoned leadership. Aside from preaching each week, he will be here on Wednesday evenings to lead prayer meeting and Bible Study. If you haven't been to these in a while, please come give them a try. Much of what he teaches feeds into the

ultimate goal of preparing our hearts for the next pastor. Keith also meets with a leadership group or committee in the church once per week. Thus far he's met with the Deacons, the Pastors, the Worship Committee, and attended Church Council. In each place he offers his council and advice, but beyond that he often offers his own assistance in specific ways that he thinks will benefit us.

The Pastor Search Committee also met this month. The major task that consumes us right now is tallying all of your responses so that we can get a general feel for the opinions of our members. It is no small task! We are happy for that, because it is evidence of how many of you took time to do your survey. We are so grateful to all of you for that! We have been quite amazed at how God is using each of our giftings thus far throughout the process. Joanne writes computer programs and has written one that will help us with the tallying. The data (your responses) is currently being entered into the program. Curt is a bit of a statistician and will help us make sense of some of the numbers. We will all look for general themes in your written answers.


If I had to give a name to this phase of the pastor search (or maybe I should say pre-search) it would be "Finding our Identity". We are learning more about who we are as a church, and more importantly what type of pastor will be able to lead us in the vision that God has for Trinity Baptist. In addition to the analyzing the survey, this month we will be initiating some of the resources available to us from the BCMD. The first will be a demographic/life segmentation. Then we will move toward a "*Portrait of a Healthy Church*" assessment. We'll find out more about that when we meet with Randy Millwood on October 21st. Both of these have a nominal fee, which is greatly reduced by grants that we are eligible for through the BCMD and the Cooperative Program. The church health assessment will involve members of the church. As we said at the start of this journey, the pastor search process will require all of us to work. Are you in?

This month please pray specifically for Pastor Keith as he helps us to prepare for the next Pastor. Pray for Pastor John as he adjusts to a new way of life, and as he and Nancy search for a new church home. Pray for the upcoming studies and for our much-anticipated meeting with Randy Millwood. Please pray for us- the Pastor Search Committee- as well. The sheer nature of the mission makes us targets for the enemy. Praise God for the smooth transition that we had this September and pray for his continued peace throughout this search.

We are so encouraged by your participation and enthusiasm for the process thus far. Please don't stop. We've got a long road to go, but we are confident that He who began a good work in Trinity Baptist Church will see it through to completion.

We started with the first century church, how it developed into the Eastern and Western churches, then through the reformation and the many denominations that developed. We already learned about the Eastern Orthodox, Roman Catholic, Lutheran, Anglican., Episcopalian, Puritan, Mennonite, and Baptist churches. We will continue by learning about the Amish, Methodist, Wesleyan, Mormon, Jehovah's Witness, and Pentecostal churches.

When we look at each of these churches, we are <u>not</u> focusing on differences, but on similarities! We are all Christians! We all seek Jesus Christ. Although we do discuss some differences that we may have in doctrines or practices concerning baptism, communion, and the Holy Trinity, and fundamental worship methods, we focus on tenets for salvation and the promise of eternal life.

Strengthen your knowledge of the Bible's instructions on these major tenets and how different churches interpret and practice them. Understand the way we can all be brothers and sisters in Christ although we may attend churches with different names. Learn how to recognize God's truth shining through his churches. Become a stronger disciple!



CHRISITIAN COLLEGE FAIR




